2. Applicant Qualifications

2.1 General Qualifications

Master's Degree Applicants

- Have completed a bachelor's degree or its equivalent, or hold documentary evidence confirming imminent completion, or be currently enrolled in the final semester of a bachelor's degree programme or its equivalent.
- Meet the specific qualifications required by the programme of application.
- Applicants wishing to apply for any type of scholarship must meet the University's foreign-language proficiency requirement, i.e. a TOEFL (Paper-Based) score of at least 450, or equivalent.

Doctoral Degree Applicants

- Have completed a master's degree or its equivalent, or hold documentary evidence confirming imminent completion, or be currently enrolled in the final semester of a master's degree programme or its equivalent.
- Alternatively, have completed a bachelor's degree or its equivalent, or hold documentary evidence confirming imminent completion, or be currently enrolled in the final semester of a bachelor's degree programme or its equivalent, with an excellent academic record or sufficient foundational knowledge, ability, and potential to undertake doctoral research.
- Meet the specific qualifications required by the programme of application.

Foreign-language proficiency requirement:

- Applicants with a TOEFL (Paper-Based) score of at least 500, or equivalent, will be admitted as regular students.
- Applicants with a TOEFL (Paper-Based) score of 400–499, or equivalent, will be admitted as regular students on the condition that they participate in the College of Graduate Studies' English Language Development Programme and continue to be examined until achieving a TOEFL (Paper-Based) score of at least 500, or equivalent, prior to their thesis defence. Programme participation costs are borne by the student.
- Applicants wishing to apply for any type of scholarship must achieve a TOEFL (Paper-Based) score of at least 500, or equivalent.

2.3 Applicants for Scholarships

Applicants wishing to apply for admission together with any type of scholarship — at both master's and doctoral level, in international programmes — must meet the University's foreign-language proficiency requirement described above.

The College of Graduate Studies

Doctor of Philosophy Program in Health Sciences (International Program)

Offered under Plans 1.1, 1.2, 2.1, and 2.2. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2565.

Plans 1.1 and 2.1 (for master's degree holders):

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent in health sciences or a related field.
- Cumulative GPA of at least 3.50 throughout the master's degree, or at least one published research article in a journal recognised by the Civil Service Commission for Higher Education Institutions, or other qualifications approved by the Programme Committee.

Plans 1.2 and 2.2 (for bachelor's degree holders):

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in health sciences or a related field.
- Cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 throughout the bachelor's degree, or at least one published research article in a journal recognised by the Civil Service Commission for Higher Education Institutions, or other qualifications approved by the Programme Committee.
- Meets the University's foreign-language proficiency requirement.

Doctor of Philosophy Program in Agriculture and Food Science

Offered under Plans 1.1, 1.2, 2.1, and 2.2. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2565.

Plan 1.1:

- Completed, or holds evidence of imminent completion of, a master's degree or equivalent in agriculture, food science, or a related field, from an institution recognised by the Office of the Higher Education Commission and/or the Civil Service Commission, with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00, or with published research experience recognised in the relevant field, or a patented work; admission is subject to the discretion of the responsible faculty in conjunction with the applicant's qualifications.

Plan 1.2:

- Completed, or holds evidence of imminent completion of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in agriculture, food science, or a related field, with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25; admission is subject to the discretion of the responsible faculty.

Plan 2.1:

- Completed, or holds evidence of imminent completion of, a master's degree or equivalent in agriculture, food science, or a related field, with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00; admission is subject to the discretion of the responsible faculty.

Plan 2.2:

- Completed, or holds evidence of imminent completion of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in agriculture, food science, or a related field, with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00; admission is subject to the discretion of the responsible faculty.
- All applicants must meet the University's foreign-language proficiency requirement.
- Any other qualifications are at the discretion of the Programme Committee.

Master of Science Program in Agriculture and Food Science

Offered under Plan A (A1 and A2) only.

- Completed a bachelor's degree in agriculture, agricultural science, agro-industry, food technology, science and food technology, biotechnology, science, or agricultural science, or an equivalent related field from an institution recognised by the University Council; or
- Approved by the Programme Committee, provided the programme is accredited by the Office of the Higher Education Commission (OHEC); or
- Currently enrolled in the final semester of a bachelor's degree in the above fields from an institution recognised by the University Council, in a programme accredited by OHEC.

School of Accountancy and Finance***Doctor of Philosophy Program in Sustainable Business Management***

Offered under Plans 1.1 and 2.1 only. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2566.

Plan 1.1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent in business administration, sustainability management, or a related field, from a recognised institution.
- Excellent academic record with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.50, or research experience with a published article, or approval from the Programme Committee.
- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement set by the College of Graduate Studies Committee.
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Plan 2.1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent in business administration, sustainability management, or a related field, from a recognised institution.

- Excellent academic record with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00, or research experience with a published article, or approval from the Programme Committee.
- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement set by the College of Graduate Studies Committee.
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Master of Business Administration Program in Sustainable Business Management

Offered under Plan 1 Academic Track 1, Plan 1 Academic Track 2, and Plan 2 Professional Track. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2566.

Plan 1, Academic Track 1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent, with one of: (i) an excellent record (GPA ≥ 3.00) in business administration, management, economics, accounting, or a related field, plus research/project experience relevant to business management; (ii) a good record (GPA ≥ 3.00) with at least 2 years of relevant managerial experience; or (iii) approval by the Programme Committee. Additional non-credit coursework may be required.
- Must not have been dismissed from an undergraduate programme for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Plan 1, Academic Track 2:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent, meeting one of several GPA/experience thresholds ranging from 2.00–2.75 in business, management, economics, or accounting, with or without relevant research or work experience, or final-year students meeting a GPA of at least 2.40, or approval by the Programme Committee.
- Must not have been dismissed from an undergraduate programme for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Plan 2, Professional Track:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in any field, meeting one of several GPA thresholds (from 2.00 upward, with or without relevant work experience of at least 1 year), or approval by the Programme Committee.
- Must not have been dismissed from an undergraduate programme for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

School of Pharmacy

Doctor of Philosophy Program in Pharmacy and Health Innovation (International Program)

Offered under Plans 1.1 and 1.2 only. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2566.

Plan 1.1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent in pharmacy, health sciences, or science, from a recognised institution.
- Excellent academic record (cumulative GPA ≥ 3.50), or research experience with a published article or patented work, or approval from the Programme Committee.
- Meets the University's foreign-language proficiency requirement.
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Plan 1.2:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in pharmacy, health sciences, or science, from a recognised institution.
- Excellent academic record (cumulative GPA ≥ 3.50), or research experience with a published article or patented work, or approval from the Programme Committee.
- Meets the University's foreign-language proficiency requirement.
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Master of Science Program in Pharmacy and Health Innovation (International Program)

Offered under Plan 1 Academic Track 1 and Plan 1 Academic Track 2 only.

Plan 1, Academic Track 1:

- Completed a bachelor's degree or equivalent in pharmacy, health sciences, or science from a recognised institution.
- Excellent academic record with a cumulative undergraduate GPA of at least 3.00 (additional non-credit coursework may be required), or approval by the Programme Committee.

Plan 1, Academic Track 2:

- Completed a bachelor's degree or equivalent in pharmacy, health sciences, or science from a recognised institution.
- Good academic record with a cumulative undergraduate GPA of at least 2.50, or approval by the Programme Committee.

School of Informatics***Doctor of Philosophy Program in Artificial Intelligence and Digital Media Innovation***

Offered under Plans 1.1 and 1.2 only. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies for International Programs (Semester System) B.E. 2566.

Plan 1.1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent from a recognised institution; or
- Meets specific qualifications set by the Programme Committee (additional foundational coursework may be required).
- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement set by the College of Graduate Studies Committee.
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Plan 1.2:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent from a recognised institution; or completion under a scholarship/research-fund sponsorship in accordance with the funder's conditions; or
- Completed a bachelor's degree with published research experience or a patented work; or
- Meets specific qualifications set by the Programme Committee (additional foundational coursework may be required).
- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement set by the College of Graduate Studies Committee.

Master of Science Program in Artificial Intelligence and Digital Media Innovation

Offered under Plan 1 Academic Track 1, Plan 1 Academic Track 2, and Plan 2 Professional Track. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies for International Programs (Semester System) B.E. 2566.

All Plans (1 Academic Track 1, 1 Academic Track 2, and 2 Professional Track):

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent from a recognised institution, meeting one of: cumulative GPA ≥ 2.50 ; or GPA ≥ 2.00 with a major-field GPA ≥ 2.75 ; or GPA ≥ 2.00 with at least 1 year of relevant work experience (supported by a letter of reference); or approval by the Programme Committee.

School of Science***Doctor of Philosophy Program in Data Science and Artificial Intelligence (International Program)***

Offered under Plans 1.1, 2.1, and 2.2. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2566.

Plan 1.1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent from a recognised institution.
- Holds relevant published research in data science and artificial intelligence, presented in a journal or international conference proceedings (at least 1 item).

- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement set by the College of Graduate Studies Committee.
- Has a Research Proposal for the intended dissertation, approved by the Programme Committee as relevant to the field.

Plan 2.1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent from a recognised institution, with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale).
- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement and has an approved Research Proposal, as above.

Plan 2.2:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent from a recognised institution, or completion under scholarship/research-fund sponsorship, with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 (on a 4.00 scale), or with published research experience or a patented work.
- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement and has an approved Research Proposal, as above.

Master of Science Program in Data Science and Artificial Intelligence (International Program)

Offered under Plan 1 Academic Track 1 and Academic Track 2 only.

Plan 1, Academic Track 1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in science or a related field from a recognised institution, meeting one of: cumulative GPA ≥ 3.25 ; or GPA below 3.25 with a Scopus-indexed publication; or GPA below 3.25 with Programme Committee approval; or Programme Committee approval alone.
- Meets the University's English-language proficiency requirement.
- Has a Research Proposal for the intended dissertation, approved by the Programme Committee as relevant to the field.

Plan 1, Academic Track 2:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in science or a related field from a recognised institution, meeting one of: cumulative GPA ≥ 2.50 ; or GPA ≥ 2.00 with a major-field GPA ≥ 2.75 ; or GPA ≥ 2.00 with at least 1 year of relevant work experience; or Programme Committee approval.
- Meets the University's English-language proficiency requirement and has an approved Research Proposal.

Doctor of Philosophy Program in Science (International Program)

Offered under Plans 1.1, 1.2, 2.1, and 2.2. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies for International Programs (Semester System) B.E. 2565.

Plans 1.1 and 2.1 (for master's degree holders):

- Completed a master's degree or equivalent in science or a related field, with an excellent academic record and at least one research article published in a journal recognised by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research and Innovation (MHESI), or other qualifications approved by the Programme Committee.

Plans 1.2 and 2.2 (for bachelor's degree holders):

- Completed a bachelor's degree or equivalent in science or a related field, with an excellent academic record and relevant research experience or at least one published article recognised by MHESI, or other qualifications approved by the Programme Committee.
- Meets the University's foreign-language proficiency requirement.
- Has a Research Proposal for the intended dissertation, approved as relevant by the Programme Committee.

Master of Science Program in Science (International Program)

Offered under Plan 1 Academic Track 1 and Academic Track 2 only.

Plan 1, Academic Track 1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in science or a related field, meeting one of: cumulative GPA ≥ 3.25 ; or GPA ≥ 3.00 with major-field GPA ≥ 3.00 ; or GPA ≥ 3.00 with research/publication experience; or Programme Committee approval.
- Meets the English-language proficiency requirement per the University's announcement on foreign-language assessment criteria for international master's programmes, B.E. 2563.

Plan 1, Academic Track 2:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in science or a related field, meeting one of: cumulative GPA ≥ 2.50 ; or GPA ≥ 2.00 with major-field GPA ≥ 2.75 ; or Programme Committee approval.
- Meets the same English-language proficiency requirement. Students may change study plan during the programme at the discretion of the Programme Committee.

School of Allied Health Sciences***Doctor of Philosophy Program in Biomedical Sciences and Health Innovations (International Program)***

Offered under Plans 1.1 and 1.2 only. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2566.

Plan 1.1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent in biomedical sciences, health sciences, biotechnology and innovation, foundational sciences, or

related fields covering data science, artificial intelligence and biomedical data analysis, or health-product development, from a recognised institution.

- Excellent academic record (cumulative GPA ≥ 3.00), or research experience with a published article recognised internationally, or a patent/petty patent, or approval from the Programme Committee.
- Meets the University's English-language proficiency requirement.
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Plan 1.2:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent in the fields listed above, from a recognised institution.
- Excellent academic record (cumulative GPA ≥ 3.25), or research experience with a published article recognised internationally, or a patent/petty patent, or approval from the Programme Committee.
- Meets the University's English-language proficiency requirement.
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

School of Public Health

Doctor of Philosophy Program in Public Health Research (International Program)

Offered under Plan 1.1 only.

- Completed a Master of Public Health or a Master of Science in environmental health, occupational health and safety, environmental sanitation, health science, medicine, or nursing, or a related field deemed relevant by the Programme Committee.
- Holds relevant research published, or presented as conference proceedings, in an international journal.
- Meets the University's foreign-language proficiency requirement.

Master of Public Health Program in Public Health Research (International Program)

Offered under Plan A, Track A1 only.

- Completed a Bachelor of Public Health (any field) or a Bachelor of Science in health sciences, with a GPA of at least 2.50 or equivalent, or a related field deemed relevant by the Programme Committee; or
- At least 2 years of relevant work experience in public health or a related field, as determined by the Programme Committee.
- Meets the University's English-language proficiency requirement.

Doctor of Philosophy Program in Health, Environment and Safety

Offered under Plans 1.1 and 2.1.

Plan 1.1:

- Completed a Master of Science, Master of Engineering, or Master of Public Health in environmental technology, safety engineering, environmental health, occupational health and safety, environmental sanitation, industrial hygiene, health sciences, public health, environmental science, or a related field deemed relevant by the Programme Committee, with relevant published research (journal article or international conference proceedings).
- Meets the English-language proficiency requirement per the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2565 and the relevant doctoral-programme criteria B.E. 2565.

Plan 2.1:

- Same field requirements as Plan 1.1 above, at the discretion of the Programme Committee.
- Meets the same English-language proficiency requirement.

Master of Science Program in Health, Environment and Safety

Offered under Plan A, Tracks A1 and A2.

Plan A, Track A1:

- Completed a Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Engineering, or Bachelor of Public Health with honours, or a GPA of at least 3.25, in environmental health, occupational health and safety, environmental sanitation, industrial hygiene, health sciences, public health, safety engineering, environmental technology, environmental science, biology, chemistry, or a related field deemed relevant by the Programme Committee; or at least 5 years of relevant work experience.
- At least one publication in a national or international journal.
- Meets the University's English-language proficiency requirement for master's-level applicants, B.E. 2565.

Plan A, Track A2:

- Completed a Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Engineering, or Bachelor of Public Health with a GPA of at least 2.75 in the fields listed above, deemed relevant by the Programme Committee; or at least 3 years of relevant work experience.
- Meets the University's English-language proficiency requirement for master's-level applicants, B.E. 2565.

School of Liberal Arts***Doctor of Philosophy Program in Liberal Arts (International Program)***

Offered under Plans 1.1, 2.1, and 2.2. General qualifications follow the University's Regulations on Graduate Studies (Semester System) B.E. 2566.

Plans 1.1 and 2.1:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a master's degree or equivalent from a recognised institution; or

- Plan 1.1 applicants must have a master's-level GPA of at least 3.50, or at least 2 years of research/professional experience, or approval by the Programme Committee (additional non-credit coursework may be required).
- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement set by the College of Graduate Studies Committee (CEFR B2 or above, or equivalent).
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Plans 1.2 and 2.2:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent from a recognised institution, or completion under scholarship/research-fund sponsorship.
- Plan 1.2 applicants must have a bachelor's-level GPA of at least 3.50, or at least 3 years of research/professional experience, or approval by the Programme Committee (additional non-credit coursework may be required).
- Meets the foreign-language proficiency requirement (CEFR B2 or above, or equivalent).
- Must not have been dismissed from graduate studies for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Master of Architecture Program in Architecture and Design

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent, meeting one of several GPA/experience thresholds from 2.00 upward, in architecture, arts, or related design fields, with or without relevant thesis, professional, or work experience, or final-year students meeting minimum GPA and prerequisite coursework, or Programme Committee approval.
- Must not have been dismissed from an undergraduate programme for academic dishonesty or other misconduct.

Plan 2, Professional Track:

- Completed, or in the final semester of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent, meeting one of several GPA thresholds from 2.00 upward, with or without relevant work experience of at least 1 year, or Programme Committee approval.
